# Player's Notes

## ROMAN KEYCARD BLACKWOOD

The Roman Keycard convention is a powerful tool. The keycards are the four aces plus the king in the agreed trump suit. This convention also lets you ask about the trump queen. Here it is in action.

**BIDDING:** South opened a weak two bid and North immediately thought of slam. However, this partnership uses undisciplined weak two bids, so there was concern about the trump quality. The answer could be found with Keycard Blackwood. South's 5♣ response showed one or four keycards so one important card was missing. The 5♦ bid asked about the spade queen and South's leap to 6♠ showed the queen but no outside king. Missing the queen, South would have bid 5♠.

**PLAY:** West lead a club and South quickly wrapped up thirteen tricks. He led the spade eight from dummy and continued with a small one to his hand. He then went back to dummy with a diamond to repeat the spade finesse. He discarded his losers on dummy's heart suit after trumping the fourth round.

To realize the value of the convention, what would you have bid if South had denied the spade queen? What if his suit was: AJ9754 or K109854? Do you still want to be in slam?

Note: While Roman Keycard is a valuable tool, the entire convention should be researched and discussed with your partner(s) before you add it to your convention card.



# Player's Notes

## RESPONDING TO PARTNER'S OVERCALL

There are many textbooks with instructions for opening bids and responding to opening bids. And, there is also a lot of information covering interventions (takeout doubles, overcalls, etc). But, one area that is unclear to many new players is how to respond to partner's overcall.

Let's first take a look at the section on the convention card "Simple Overcall". The typical high card point range (hcp) entered is 8-16. This is fine but don't be rigid about this. For example if your right hand opponent opens 1♣ and you hold: ♠6 ♥AKJ1043 ♦AK6 ♣K76, you should overcall 1♥ instead of making a takeout double. If not, either the opponents or your partner might bid a lot of spades before you are able to show your good heart suit. Always think how the auction may continue before you make a takeout double.

In response to partner's overcall, we have the simple raise, the preemptive jump raise, forward-going NT bids, or a cue bid of opener's suit to ask partner about his strength. But, before you can agree the cue bid promises support, you must decide if a new suit bid by advancer (overcaller's partner) is forcing. Most play that it is not forcing but simply an attempt to improve the contract. If this is your agreement, the cue bid is merely forcing and may or may not show support. After advancer cue bids, the auction is forcing until a previously bid suit has been rebid or raised, or game has been reached.

What about a jump shift by advancer? Since most play a new suit as non-forcing, many play that a jump in a new suit is forcing or at least highly invitational. Holding ♠Q2 ♥108 ♦AQ9 ♣AQ10987 with this auction:

OPP	PARD	OPP	YOU
1♥	1♠	P	??

The reasoning is since 2♣ is not forcing, then 3♣ should show a good hand. If you first cue bid 2♥, the bidding may get too high before you are able to show your club suit. If partner has a weak overcall and no real fit for clubs, he is allowed to pass. Remember, either a simple new suit or a jump by advancer almost always denies support for your overcall suit.

As always, there are other accepted methods, so you need to discuss these with your partner. Here is a chart that you may want to use:

# Alert Procedures

(The 1st of a series on the subject of Alerts)

## INTRODUCTION

The objective of the Alert system is for both pairs at the table to have equal access to all information contained in any auction. In order to meet this goal, it is necessary that all players understand and practice the principles of Full Disclosure and Active Ethics. Ethical bridge players will recognize the obligation to give complete explanations. They will accept the fact that any such information is entirely for the benefit of the opponents, and may not be used to assist their own partnership.

This procedure uses the admittedly "fuzzy" terminology of "highly unusual and unexpected" as the best practical solution to simplifying the Alert Procedure. "Highly unusual and unexpected" should be determined in light of historical usage rather than local geographical usage. To ensure full disclosure, however, at the end of the auction and before the opening lead declarers are encouraged to volunteer to explain the auction (including available inferences). According to the Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge: Law 40.B. Concealed Partnership Understandings Prohibited

A player may not make a call or play based on a special partnership understanding unless an opposing pair may reasonably be expected to understand its meaning, or unless his side discloses the use of such call or play in accordance with the regulations of the sponsoring organization. Bridge is not a game of secret messages; the auction belongs to everyone at the table.

Remember that the opponents are entitled to know the agreed meaning of all calls. The bidding side has an obligation to disclose its agreements according to the procedures established by ACBL. When asked, the bidding side must give a full explanation of the agreement. Stating the common or popular name of the convention is not sufficient. The opponents need not ask exactly the "right" question. Any request for information should be the trigger. Opponents need only indicate the desire for information - all relevant disclosure should be given automatically. The proper way to ask for information is "please explain."

Players who remember that a call requires an Alert but cannot remember the meaning must still Alert. In all Alert situations, Tournament Directors should rule with the spirit of the Alert procedure in mind and not simply by the letter of the law. Players who, by experience or expertise, recognize that their opponents have neglected to Alert a special agreement will be expected to protect themselves.

Adjustments for violations are not automatic. There must have been misinformation. An adjustment will be made only when the misinformation was a direct cause of the damage. Note also that an opponent who actually knows or suspects what is happening, even though not properly informed, may not be entitled to redress if he or she chooses to proceed without clarifying the situation. When an Alert is given, ASK, do not ASSUME.

## ANNOUNCEMENTS

An announcement is one word or a short phrase that tells the opponents directly the meaning of partner's call. When bidding boxes are used, the "Alert" strip is tapped also. Announcements are required in the following instances:

After a natural one no-trump opening bid: Responder will say aloud, "15 to 17".

After a transfer response at any level to any level natural no-trump opening, overcall or rebid: 1NT-P-2D  
The 1NT bidder will say aloud, "Transfer."

After a 1NT forcing or semi-forcing response to a one-level opening bid with no interference: 1H-P-1NT, the opening bidder will say aloud, "Forcing" or "Semi-forcing,"

After a non-forcing opening one level bid or a bid for which the opener could have fewer than three cards in the suit opened. After the opening bid, Responder will say aloud, "May be short."

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE ALERTER OR ANNOUNCER TO ENSURE THAT THE OPPONENTS ARE AWARE THAT AN ALERT HAS BEEN MADE. WHEN IN DOUBT WHETHER TO ALERT OR NOT, ALERT!

**FAILURE TO ALERT OR ANNOUNCE**

If partner fails to Alert or Announce, a player may not make any indication during the auction. Showing surprise or discomfort may awaken partner to the error and would be a violation of Law. In addition, a player may not make allowances for partner's error. The auction must continue as if partner had acted properly.

When the auction is over, the declaring side MUST reveal to the defenders, after first calling the Tournament Director, any errors of explanation (including Alerts or Announcements that were omitted) before the opening lead is faced. A defender MUST reveal any of his partner's errors but may NOT do so until after the play has been completed. A defender (or any other player) who becomes aware of his own error or omission should correct it immediately. Again, in either case the Tournament Director should be called first.
