The Monday afternoon Daytime Duplicate Club will move to the Fort Collins Senior Center in January of next year. The Fort Collins Duplicate Player's Club that meets on Wednesday evenings will move one block east to the Community of Christ Church. This move is effective November 2008. DID YOU KNOW?

Law 16 Interpretations -- Hesitation to a Pass

Law 16 is a broad rule dealing with unauthorized information of various sorts. One type is unauthorized information from partner as follows:

"After a player makes extraneous information available to his partner by an action such as a remark, a question, a reply to a question, an unmistakable hesitation, unusual speed, special emphasis, tone, gesture, movement, mannerism or any other action that suggests a call, lead or plan of play, the partner may not choose from among logical alternatives that could have demonstrably been suggested over another by the extraneous information"

This is as clear as mud, isn't it? This law is often the source of contention at the bridge table. Let's try to clarify the frequent case of "Hesitation to a Pass".

- 1) You are allowed to take as much time as needed to make a call.
- 2) But, if you hesitate and then pass during an auction, partner has the unauthorized information that you were thinking about something.
- 3) Partner may not choose an action based on that unauthorized information. He/she can make any call they wish, however that call must demonstrably have not been suggested by the break in tempo. The burden is placed on partner to demonstrate that their action was based on their bridge judgment and the cards they hold.

East has the problem here. East has unauthorized information that West had something to think about after South bid 4♠. East may not make a call that could have been suggested by the break in tempo. In this case, the hesitation by West may suggest that he wanted to bid on or to double the opponents. East has a totally routine 2♥ opener so Pass is the only reasonable action available for East based on the cards held.

Bridge-3: Defense Strategy & Opening Leads **Dick Webster – ACBL Accredited Teacher**

When playing bridge, you are the defender on average 50% of the time. Whether you are a novice or an intermediate seeking to improve your defense techniques, this eight-week course can help you improve your defender play (opening leads, 3rd-hand play, 2nd-hand play, defensive signals and discarding). Included will be opportunities to review modern bidding and declarer play. "Defense in the 21st Century" (updated 2007) is the third of the five-book bridge series from the ACBL. Because defense requires good partnership communication, the greatest benefit will be when you register with your regular partner...but this is not the content of the previous course. The text-workbook needed will be available for purchase (\$19) at the first class. BRIDGE-1 BIDDING & RESPONDING and BRIDGE-2 PLAY OF THE HAND are recommended, but not required.

Conventions are important and here's an example of how using the right tool can keep you out of trouble.

BIDDING: South was interested in slam as soon as he heard his partner's 1NT opening bid. His bid of 4♣ was the Gerber convention asking for the number of aces. The 4♥ response showed only one so South reluctantly signed off in game.

PLAY: With no attractive lead, West led his singleton diamond and hit pay dirt when his partner won the ace. East returned the seven of diamonds requesting a heart return (higher of the other two suits). West ruffed and East won the heart continuation but West had no more trumps so declarer scored up the game. The pairs who first bid their spade suit and then used Blackwood ended up down one in 5♠ on the same defense. Those unsuccessful pairs were certainly unlucky, but the South hand needs only to discover the number of aces and the Gerber convention was created for just that purpose.

The Gerber convention is generally used after a 1NT or 2NT opening bid. It may also be used after a jump in notrump.



IMPROVE YOUR PLAY

Many players become confused during the auction and think that points and tricks are the same. Unfortunately, sometimes holding a lot of high card points does not mean you have a lot of defensive tricks.

BIDDING: South only held eleven high card points but his 6-5 distribution made this an opening hand. West had a very nice hand and started with a takeout double. North's 2NT bid showed a limit raise or better in spades. This convention allows the partnership to use a jump to 3♠ over a takeout double as preemptive. South really liked his hand opposite four or more trumps so he bid the game. West couldn't stand it and doubled again. Poor East decided that bidding his long suit at the five level would be suicidal so he passed.

PLAY: West led a high diamond, cashed the ace of hearts, and switched to a trump. Declarer had no trouble winning the rest of the tricks. He was able to ruff two diamonds in dummy, discard one on the heart King, and another on the club Jack after the Queen was ruffed out. Making an overtrick was worth +690 and all of the matchpoints. As he left the table West said to his partner "But I had nineteen points". East just shook his head.
