IMPROVE YOUR PLAY

with Larry Matheny

Many players don't appreciate the differences between matchpoint (pairs) games and team events. In a pairs event overtricks are very important while in a team game the safety of the contract is paramount. This hand illustrates how different the two games really are.

BIDDING: North jumped to show club shortness, 4+ spades, and 13-15 support points. Knowing his club king was of little value, South signed off in game.

PLAY: West led a low club won by East with the ace. East shifted to a low heart and declarer stopped to study the hand. It appeared he had only three possible losers: one heart, one diamond, and the club. In a team game or at rubber bridge the hand would be easy...win the ace of hearts and draw trumps. But this was matchpoint scoring and if the heart king was in the East hand, declarer would make at least one overtrick by finessing. Even if the heart lead was a singleton, South might still be able to make the hand if the king of diamonds was in the West hand. But both red kings were off-side and the heart was a singleton so declarer went down in a contract that could have been made. However in a pairs event, South played the hand correctly. The odds were far too good to forego the heart finesse.

♣♦♥♠

TEN HELPFUL HINTS

Etiquette: When the bidding is over, make your opening lead BEFORE you enter the contract in your scorecard. Don't make three other players wait on you. Also, no matter how badly your partner plays or what uncertainty arises, you must refrain from making gestures, facial expressions, or other signs of discomfort.

Tempo: Make your bids and play your cards in an even tempo. While there are times when you must stop to ponder the correct bid or play, it often gives away information. For example, a fast Pass, particularly after a jump bid by your right hand opponent, makes it clear you have a weak hand. It goes without saying that it is unethical to hesitate when you have no problem deciding which card to play.

Defender Tips: When defending, study dummy as soon as it hits the table. Decide which card you will play when that suit is led. This will eliminate the need to stop and wonder later if you should cover an honor or play low. Remember, your hesitation gives away information.

Opening Lead: When on opening lead in a SUIT contract, NEVER, NEVER, NEVER under lead an ace. Okay...there are exceptions, but the under lead of an ace is deceptive and could confuse partner. Also, leading an ace is usually not a good idea. Aces are definitely meant to capture kings and queens.

Evaluating Your Hand: Listen to the bidding and reevaluate your high cards. You should tend to discount queens and jacks in the opponents' suits and upgrade honors in suits bid by your partner. For example, a king in a suit bid by your left hand opponent may not be as valuable as if your partner or your right hand opponent bids that suit.

More Score Sheet Etiquette: Do not leave your scorecard open on the table. Unfortunately there are unethical players who might be tempted to look.

Speak Softly: Speak in a low tone when discussing the hands. It is difficult to be objective when you play the next set of boards after hearing a person at that table say, "That's +1470 for 6NT making seven".

Opening 1NT: Do not let a small doubleton deter you from opening 1NT. For example ♠65 ♥AK65 ♦QJ8 ♣AQ76 is an ideal hand to open 1NT. If you open 1♣, what will you rebid after partner's 1♠ response?

Remember the Bidding: Remember to consider the bidding throughout the play of the hand. There is information there about suit strength and length if you just listen. This is important both as declarer and as a defender.

Count! Count! Count! Count your cards, count your high card points, count dummy's points, count declarer's points, count declarer's distribution, and count your partner's distribution. These are good habits and are not as difficult as you may think.

DID YOU KNOW

ANNOUNCEMENTS: An announcement is a one word or short phrase which tells the opponents directly the meaning of partner's call. With bidding boxes the "Alert" card should also be used when making the announcement.

ANNOUNCEMENTS ARE REQUIRED IN THE FOLLOWING FOUR INSTANCES ONLY:

1. Stating the range of OPENING one no-trump bids. (NOT one no-trump overcalls)
2. After a transfer response to a major suit at any level to any level natural notrump opening or overcall.
3. After a one no-trump Forcing or Semi-Forcing response to a one heart or one spade opening bid with no interference. (This is common practice in 2/1 Game Force systems.)
4. State "short" after all non-forcing opening bids of one club or one diamond which may be fewer than three cards.

From The ACBL Club Directors Handbook, pages 56-57. Emphasis added in parenthesis.

Any other "Announcement", even if intended to be "active ethics" is, in fact, giving unauthorized information to your partner as to what you interpreted their bid to mean. This is clearly not allowed. You should NEVER offer interpretations of bids unless the opponents ask for an explanation. While the statement may be made with the best of intentions of "full disclosure", this kind of "free" vocalization is completely inappropriate and should be avoided in competitive bridge.

The ALERT system allows an opportunity for opponents to get clarifications of special bids. The information should not be stated without being asked as this only serves to allow verbal communication within a partnership when no information should be exchanged.
